Meghna Shah, MD



Service at HMC

Edie tells us that at the end of March, Harborview introduced the new RODEO (Rapid OR Decision, **Evaluation and Optimization**) service. This is a team of perioperatively-trained advanced practice providers (APPs) who will be focusing on standardizing and accelerating preoperative evaluations for inpatients at HMC, with the goal of reducing surgical delays and cancellations. RODEO will be consulted directly by surgical teams when the decision to operate is made, and will coordinate directly with Anesthesia, consulting services and the patient's primary team.
