Award Highlights

Brandon Fainstad and Carolyn Sy were recipients of the 2017 UWMC Patient Safety Hero award.

Mike Lenaeus and Amanda Shepherd received a grant award from the Department of Medicine. They are hosting a Just In Time simulation session for the interns to model paracentesis and point of care ultrasound for their internal med wards rotation. They are collecting data to assess the effect of this intervention on rates and types of procedure related complications as well as use of albumin and blood products.

Teaching Tip: Mutual exchange of learning goals
